

Protect Your Hearing All Summer Long

Summer is a season of concerts, fireworks, outdoor work, and loud recreational activities—all of which can pose a risk to your hearing. Noise-induced hearing loss (NIHL) is preventable, yet once it occurs, it's often irreversible. Here's how to protect your hearing while still enjoying the sounds of summer:



• Be Smart with Sound Exposure

Whether you're mowing the lawn, attending a music festival, or watching a fireworks show, the risk of hearing damage increases with prolonged exposure to sounds over 85 decibels. Keep earplugs handy and wear them in loud environments. Foam earplugs are inexpensive and easy to carry; reusable musician-grade earplugs preserve sound quality while lowering volume.

➡ Watch Out for Recreational Risks

Boating, jet skiing, and off-roading all produce loud engine noise. If you're the driver or spending extended time near engines, wear noise-reducing earmuffs or plugs. Protecting your ears on the water is just as important as protecting your skin from the sun.

FF Keep Volume in Check

Listening to music through headphones during travel or workouts? Follow the 60/60 rule: listen at no more than 60% volume for no longer than 60 minutes at a time. Noise-canceling headphones help you avoid turning the volume up to drown out background noise.

录 Stay Vigilant with Kids

Children's ears are more sensitive, yet they're often exposed to loud toys, games, and events. Provide child-sized hearing protection at parades, sporting events, or loud family activities, and model good habits yourself.




